## But He Said ... Don't be Slow of Heart

### Luke 24:13-32

# I. While Jesus was with his disciples, he quoted the scriptures concerning himself to them often:

- a. They did not hear or <u>understand</u>
- b. He plainly told them he had to suffer before entering his glory
- c. <u>His death</u> became <u>a stumbling block</u> for them

#### II. Talking with these two disciples on the way to Emmaus, they tell him -

- a. They believed him to have been <u>a mighty prophet</u> in word and deed before God and all the people.
- b. How the <u>religious leaders delivered Him up</u> to be crucified
- c. How <u>they had trusted</u> that He would have been the one <u>to redeem</u> <u>Israel</u>; on top of that – it has been 3 days since he died.

#### III. They continue to doubt the words concerning Him:

- a. The women told of their encounter with the angles, telling them that <u>he was risen as he said</u> was like a fable being told to them.
- b. Others went to the grave and told the same thing that <u>he was not in</u> <u>the grave</u>

#### IV. The disciples had been too dependent upon his physical presence to really hear the words that were coming out of his mouth. They did not learn that it was <u>the words he spoke that was their life:</u>

- **a.** They heard only <u>the parts they wanted to hear</u> that he had a kingdom and nothing about the suffering and dying.
- V. Many puzzling and perplexing things in our lives, would be both plain and profitable if we rightly understood and believed the words of Christ.

#### VI. Failure to believe results in a failure to see and recognize Jesus:

- a. They had to have physical evidence breaking of break, feeling the nail prints in his hand, the hole in his side.
- b. <u>They failed to see his glory because they failed to hear and believe his</u> words. Before he was to reign, he had to suffer. He had to bear his cross before he wears his crown death before life. They should have remembered "**But he said**, *I will rise again* the third day."

Areas in our life of doubt, confusion, hopelessness, darkness, etc. – Our response should be ...<u>But He Said</u>.....
