James 5:7-15

- 1. **Be patient** hold fast
 - Endure suffering, persecution, mistreatment
 - □ Why be patient?
 - We are waiting for something what?
 - Waiting for the coming of the Lord
 - Like the farmer waiting on the rains, former and latter
 - □ Doesn't harvest after first sight of growth more growth to come if he waits for the latter rain.
 - Seedtime (early rain) and harvest-time (latter rain)
- 2. Stablish (strengthen, steadfast, sure-up, stabilize) your heart how?
 - Let your faith be firm unwavering
 - Practice what is right constantly and consistently
 - Let your resolve (decision or declaration) for God and heaven be fixed
 - We do this in conjunction with daily asking God to search our hearts
 - Christ then stablishes our hearts unblameable in holiness (I Thes. 3:13)
 - Romans 12:12 Rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer
 - **2 Cor. 4:**8 We are troubled on every side, but not distressed (worried or overcome); we are perplexed (complicated or full of difficulty), but not in despair (to lose all hope or confidence); (V9) Persecuted (harassed, grieved or afflicted), but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed;

I Thessalonians 3:13

To the end he may stablish your hearts unblameable in holiness before God, even our Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all his saints.

I Peter 5:10

But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle you.
