Isaiah 40:31

1. Eagle – symbol of power, courage, and keen vision:

- **Builds nest** high up a tree or on a rocky ledge
- Vision can spot a prey from a mile and a half up in the sky
- Has a wing span 6 to 7 ¹/₂ feet wide
- **Soars** on jet streams of air
- 2. Wait on the Lord for what:
 - For instructions Moses told the priest that had touched a dead body to wait until he received instructions from the Lord as to weather they could offer sacrifices or not.
 - If God permitted a tragedy then why should I wait on Him? Because <u>at his</u> <u>set time, he will send deliverance</u>, but if you have fainted and gone to the arms of flesh, you will not live to see the blessing of His deliverance.
 - Bring your request to him and David said to <u>wait expectantly</u> for his help
 - He give strength to the weary and power to him who lacks might

3. Though vigorous young men stumble and grow weary and tired, those that wait:

- Will gain new strength
- Will mount up with wings like eagles
- Will run and not bet tired
- Will walk and become weary

4. Wait on the Lord: (Qavah) to expect, to look for patiently, to trust

- Have you not heard that the eternal <u>God does not grow tired or weary</u>?
- Why say my way is hid from the Lord? My justice due me escapes the notice of my God?
- *Psalm 27:14* "Wait on the Lord ; be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart; wait I say, on the Lord."

- **5.** Eagle mots once a year it sheds its old worn feathers for a new set and its strength is renewed.
- 6. Build nest high on a cliff for 3 reasons:
 - **Protection** from enemies
 - **High perch** for survey of territory below
 - Energy saving launch pad

7. God's word is to us as the eagle's nest is to the eagle

- It is <u>our shield</u> from the enemies of our souls
- Gives us a strategic view to the world around us warns us of dangers
- Launching from the eternal word we can soar upon the winds of the Holy Spirit
